



Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. Hebrews 11:1

When I was first called to seminary, one of the things I leaned on was the scripture above. As I entered that first class among strangers, questioning why God wanted me here, I knew I needed to trust and grow in faith but I did not know from whence that faith would come.

What is Faith? Faith is an unshakable belief in God and the promises of God. Faith is developed in us and for us through our worship, our studies, our walk with God and with each other.

Faith also involves listening and obeying God's commands in our lives. In other words, we are expected to put such confidence in God that we do the things that will deepen our faith. Even things that are uncomfortable or that take extra time, or that we don't always understand at first. *That's why I went to seminary, because to grow in faith, I had to take a leap.* And while the definition of faith describes an unshakable belief, sometimes we do shake and our faith waivers. That's why for the next year we are focusing on the verse from 2 Corinthians, 'For we walk by faith, not by sight'. If it were up to us, our faith would stop before we get out of bed on Sunday mornings. But thankfully, our God is calling us to more.

This August 26, Rally Day at SOPC you might find yourself anywhere on the faith spectrum. Maybe you are learning to trust again- in God or in the church. Maybe you are a newly joined member who is seeking to be accepted and belong. Maybe you are a soon to be joined member who longs for a family of faith to walk with you. Or maybe you are a member of many years who longs to help others grow in faith alongside you. *This thing called faith does not care how long you have been here, only that you are willing to take a leap towards Christ, heeding scriptures and "growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18).*

No matter where you are on your faith journey Rally Day is a day to inquire how your faith will grow this next year. There are new Sunday School classes to try on, new Bible studies to endeavor, new ways to make friends. *Faith is calling each of us. Won't you come and see how God is making space for faith in you? "Faith is taking the first step even when you don't see the whole staircase.." Martin Luther King, Jr.*

I will also be reaching out to these families. During the week the children and volunteers explored the idea that no matter what (when we are sad, happy, thankful, etc.) God is **always** with us. I had and have heard many of the children asked if "VBS could be everyday", they also asked if they could "really talk to God at any time". Mission trip

We left on Sunday July 29th to head to Nashville, TN. We have two adults and three youth attending. We will stay at Dalewood UMC along with about 100 other youth and volunteers from across the country.

Projects during the week included:

- Working with lower-income children through an organization that offers tutoring, summer camp, a basketball league, job skills training, and other activities as a positive alternative to the streets.
- Assisting refugees through a ministry that engages churches, other organizations, and individuals to assist immigrants and refugees in the region.
- Serving with a local summer school that works to increase literacy to keep kids off the streets
- Helping teach rising Kindergartners their basics like ABC's, colors, shapes and work with them on reading in a safe summer environment.
- Encouraging older adults with cognitive or physical limitations to engage in activities.
- Providing help to seniors that are unable to work on the inside and outside of their homes.
- Packaging and delivering diapers to families through the Diaper Connection.

WHAT ARE THE PROGRAMS LIKE?

Jesus-centered. Our goal is to point people to Jesus. Programs focus on Bible passages and daily themes that challenge us to respond to Jesus in ways we will never forget.

Interactive. People learn better by doing. Participants will be involved in sharing, speaking, singing, acting, reflecting...not just sitting and watching.

Relevant. Through creative multimedia, thought provoking sound and video, and moving contemporary worship, programs are designed to reach everyone.

Fun. Relationship-building activities, games and having fun are part of every program. Expect to have a great time!

At its last Stated Meeting, on July 15, 2018 your Session . . .

1. Approved adding the position of Membership Secretary to our annual election of Treasurer and Clerk of Session.
2. Approved Shelagh Wirth to continue as Membership Secretary for the 2018-2019 year.
3. Heard that PW had a salad supper and approximately 40 women attended.
4. Heard that PW will install their new officers on Sunday, August 12.
5. Heard that Rally Day will be August 26 and breakfast will be served.
6. Heard that usher and greeter training will be held at 9:00 a.m. on August 19th.
7. Elected John Jones to serve as our Elder-Commissioner for the Trinity Presbytery meeting on August 11.
8. Heard that we currently have cash of \$134,000 and pledges of \$65,000 for a total of \$199,000 in the organ fund. Of the \$134,000 in cash, \$38,250 has already been paid as a deposit, so it is no longer in the checking account.
9. Heard that we will participate in the Migrant Ministry meal on July 24th.
10. Heard that our next Family Promise week will be August 5 – 12 and volunteers are needed.
11. Heard that the Missions Ministry made a donation of \$1,500.00 to the youth mission trip.
12. Heard that the Grant Program will be restarted this Fall.
13. Learned that the Mission Ministry is exploring a partnership with a Cuban Church.
14. Moved several members to the inactive roster.
15. Approved a “Singles” dinner and movie to be held in Fellowship Hall in the near future.
16. Was reminded that elders now have magnetic elder name tags and have been asked to wear them any time guests to SOPC may be present so we can enhance our “Welcoming Church” philosophy.
17. Received some requests for the use of our church facilities. The Building and Grounds ministry will seek further information on these requests.
18. Approved the use of our church facilities by the Trinity Presbytery women on March 16, 2019.
19. Approved Kathy Keane to serve as an advisor on the missions trip to Nashville with Michaela Craven and youth this July/August.
20. Approved the Sunday School Teachers for the 2018-2019 calendar year.
21. Approved the ministry Architects “Spice Rack” curriculum for Middle School Sunday School this Fall.
22. Heard that Ed Keelen will be Sunday School Superintendent for the coming year.
23. Heard that the theme for Koinonia this year will be “Getting to know your Neighbor”. Jeanne LeBoeuf will be heading up the Koinonia committee.
24. Heard that we are developing a convergence Brewing the Faith Sunday School class that will appeal to new members and those who currently do not attend Sunday School. Ben Smith and Rusty Creighton will teach this class.
