 *As we grow we are increasing our needs for volunteers. If you would like to volunteer to work with the children or youth for any of these events, please let Michaela know!

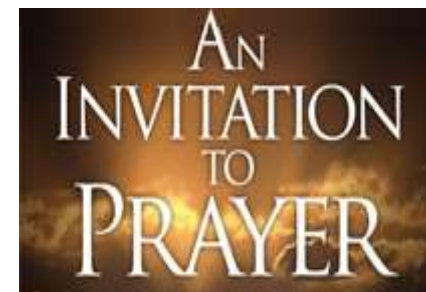

SESSION NEWS

At its last Stated meeting, on October 15, your Session...

- Received, read and discussed seeking to be "Faithful Together: Guidelines for Presbyterian During times of Disagreement" which was adopted by the 20th General Assembly (1992) of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) for use by sessions and congregations.
- Heard reports on the activities of our Pastor and Parish Associate.
- Heard that the Presbyterian Women will be collecting the Thank Offering during the next month and that envelopes will be available in the pews for anyone who wishes to participate.
- Heard a report from Elizabeth Taylor, chairperson of our Pastor Nominating Committee. She reminded us of the ministry information form which we completed in 2017 and in which we specified the kind of pastor we were seeking and in which we also specified the leadership competencies which the pastor we needed must possess. These competencies were: *Preaching and worship - Spiritual maturity - Strength and Vision - Communication - Change agent - Interpersonal Engagement - Compassionate Bridge Builder - Decision making - Collaboration*
Our form was approved by the Session before it was submitted. The PNC was of one mind in recommending Rev. Creighton to our congregation.
- Safety Committee Update: Agreed on the date of Dec 17th for safety training led by Lexington County Sheriff's Department, if they are available.
- Vitalization: Shared elder experiences and learnings from our neighborhood analysis for vitalization of Seven Oaks.
- Were informed that vitalization surveys are submitted this week and SOPC will be made aware of results when returned.
- Accepted, with regret, the resignation of Elder John Jones.
- Changed the Session meeting time to 6:00 p.m. beginning with the November meeting.
- Decided to form a Task Force to work towards reconciliation.
- Approved a motion to not fill elder vacancies until the 2019 Nominating Committee can meet and nominate candidates per policy manual.
- Approved the Administration ministry renewing our CD, that expires soon, for the least amount of time and at the largest interest rate available.
- Signed cards to congregation members and friends who have experienced illness or joys in recent weeks.
- Heard that we will host a prayer vigil on November 13 from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.
