In the church, stewardship usually means fundraising and pledge campaigns. In reality, stewardship means “taking care of” or “managing.” What we are called to take care of, to manage, is the ministry and mission God has given us as a community and as individuals. This is certainly more than fundraising and pledge campaigns!

The truth is that we need money to support the ministry and mission of SOPC; but we need even more than that. Stewardship is about a lot more than money; it's more about giving back in response to God's giving to us to do God's work of love in the world.

We don't give to get something. We don't give a certain amount and then expect God to give back like an investment banker. We don't give out of guilt. We don't give because we think God is going to sit on high and punish us if we don't.

We give out of gratitude. We give because God gave us life, abundant life, and God gave us love, unconditional love. There really is no way to thank God adequately for those great gifts, or the other gifts. But, we can give of our gifts so that others can come to know and experience the fullness of life and love in God.

Stewardship is about learning together how to be generous like God is generous. It is about growing in the love of God and neighbor and in so doing, allowing God to grow our spiritual faith.

From the Pastor

I received a card from Pat Robosky with this quote that threads through today's message. It begins by saying: *'I was regretting the past, and fearing the future. Suddenly my Lord was speaking: My Name is I Am'*. Below is one story of how we live into our image of God as 'I Am'.

What I remember the most about fall (other than football) is raking chestnut leaves in our yard on crisp Saturday mornings. While I worked hard, I also came to depend on the kindness of neighbors, despite our differing faith traditions and beliefs. Our Jewish neighbors would welcome us in for jelly belly's and peanut butter snacks, our Catholic neighbors would offer cookies on the lawn and play on a lazy day, and our non-religious neighbors allowed me to water their yard when they were away. We were a bit like a family of sorts. As I grew into a teenager, these same neighbors aged and began to move away. I never told them just how important they were to my growing up. How I learned about being a family from them. *'God paused. I waited. God continued saying 'When you live in the past with its mistakes and regrets. It is hard. I am not there. My name is not 'I WAS'.'*

In our early 20's, newly married and living across country, I feared what life would bring. Particularly as 9/11 made terror freshly real in our world, I questioned our purpose. No longer was the world idyllic, no longer were there trustworthy neighbors, and no longer were we 'safe'. *God says 'When you live in the future, with its problems and fears, it is hard. I am not there. My name is not 'I WILL BE'*

In my forties now, the perception of our world has changed. I cannot recreate the past, nor would I want to. I will not live in the future, it holds nothing but fears that do not resemble the promise of our God. But I do still long for a family, yes, even with quarrels and disagreements. Now I recognize, however, that the family I seek is the one based in God himself. It is the people whom God gives us to be in **relationship** with daily. *'When you live in this moment, it is not hard. I am here. My name is 'I AM'.*

As your pastor, I am grateful to have the privilege of leading the church in seeking the 'I AM' in our new season. I am grateful that God has called us to be in relationship first and foremost with the 'I Am' who has called us each to this place. I am grateful for those who are ready to embrace this sense of family, including the Wednesday night supper theme of 'Getting to know your Neighbors'. I also challenge you to embrace this sense of security of both the past and the future. If you haven't come to sit with me and share your history, your concerns, your joys I invite you again. It is in this relationship that we come to know 'I AM'. It is here that stewardship becomes real- we give out of thanks for this presence of God. It is here that we begin to walk together in faith, not by sight. One step at a time, one leaf at a time, one relationship at a time. Let's begin with 'I AM'.

**PW 101.4:** PW Connectionalism Mirrors That of the Church.

It is said that Presbyterians approach every task in a way that is decent, in good order, and in community. That helps us better understand why our denomination and Presbyterian Women are organized at all levels of the church: congregation, presbytery (made up of several congregations in a region), synod (made up of several presbyteries), and churchwide (or national). This connectional system allows ideas and information to flow through the organization, strengthening the ministry and mission of all. Our connectional system is undergirded with roles and responsibilities assumed by those called to lead and participate at each level. The circle, at the congregational level, is the foundation of PW, and informs and responds to the ministry of PW. PW at each level is led by a coordinating team. 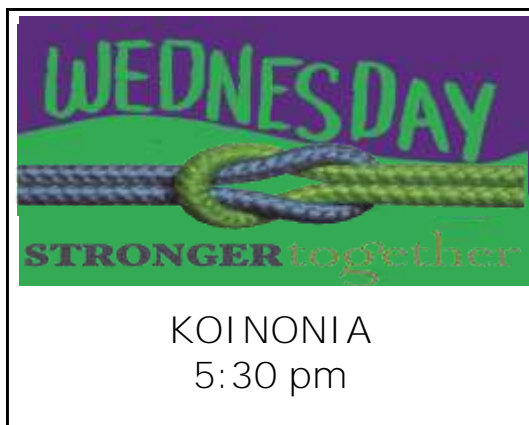
