# Merry Christmas

A few weeks ago, your pastors were given a gift, a basket full of goodies that were nothing remarkable and yet something amazing at the same time. I can only imagine why the gift giver chose that moment to honor her pastors with such thoughtfulness. But it brought me to tears. After the gluten free pretzels were long eaten, one particular item spoke to me, a package full of different types of glue. In it a poem read this, "The glue is for when you are falling apart and life seems somewhat unsteady. Just smear some on and wait a bit and then you will feel more ready".

There are times this Advent season when each of us will feel the need for glue in our lives. Some from the loss of our loved ones, others from grasping with church change, and even some who long for God's Kingdom to come. Some of us will even have to scrape off the old dried glue to make the new glue stick! The good news is that the glue we seek doesn't come in a bottle or a stick (so if you are fresh out, no worries, unlike batteries on Christmas morning)! The glue we need comes in a Savior, as a child, born in the manger, waiting for us as we approach Christmas Morning. It comes in the hope of a King, born in Bethlehem, lover of God's church. In fact, the glue is delivered long before we knew we needed putting back together. That's how this basket showed up on Alice and I's doorsteps. It was delivered by hands long before we knew this was what we needed.

This advent season, if you find yourself in need of some glue, don't feel alone. This sometimes happens when we learn to walk on faith and not by sight, we trip and we stumble and sometimes we fall and need to be put back together. But this need for 'togetherness' is in fact an invitation this Christmas season. It's an invitation to lean in on the one who desires to hold us together, our Savior. It is also an invitation to be one another's glue. That way when we trip and stumble, we can be there to catch each other, long before we knew we needed someone there to catch us.

This Advent, May we gather at the stable bare and await the coming of the babe who I pray, will bind us together in love and harmony this Christmas Season.

### Providence Men's Home

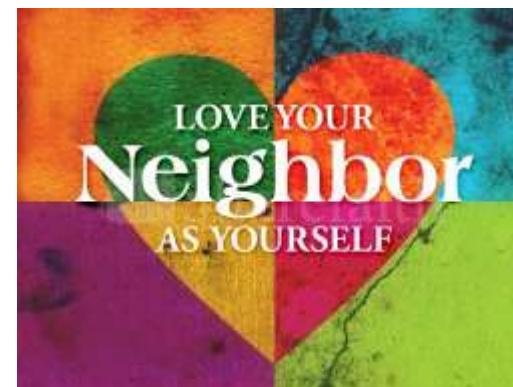

### At its last Stated Meeting, on November 19, your Session...

1. Heard that Boot Camp is going well and is averaging 16-20 in the adult class, 10 in JAM and 5 in the Confirmation class. where new members are attending and old members are growing in Biblical growth and knowledge. Thanks be to God!
2. Learned that our Candlelight Christmas worship service will be at 5:00 p.m. based on the worship committee's recommendations.
3. Learned that the Presbyterian Women are placing Thank offering envelopes and Missions is placing Thornwell envelopes in the pew pockets in the Narthex. We were reminded to be sure we are utilizing the correct envelope during this season of thanksgiving.
4. Learned that Presbyterian Women will be seeking help in securing the items for the health kits for Church Women United in the coming year.
5. Heard that vitalization planning is scheduled with the Presbytery for January 2019 and gave thanks for the opportunity to seek God's will for SOPC.

## PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN



**PW 101.5:** PW 101.2 introduced the idea that PW groups at the congregational level consist of circles. The circle is the foundation of all that PW does. PW 101.4 introduced the idea that PW is connectional and that the PW in the Congregation (PWC) is connected to PW at each level. To elaborate: The PWC group informs and responds to the ministry of PW at all levels of the church: local, presbytery, synod and churchwide.

The PWC has representation and contact with the PW in the Presbytery (PWP); the PWP connects to PW in the Synod (PWS); and the PWS connects to PW Churchwide. Information and programming moves in all directions throughout the structure, with local and regional work impacting national work, and national work informing regional and local work. There is good work happening in PW all of the time, from the mission of a local church in Boise to the fulfillment of a Thank Offering grant in Sudan! In 1988, Christie Loney wrote: The circle can be a place that challenges us to stretch beyond our known limits. Within the confines of a loving, accepting community we can take risky steps, fail and not feel foolish. This enables us to move beyond the safe place, reach out to others and have our faith tested. In the circle, Christian leadership is born, nurtured and sent forth into ministry. Maybe you are a young woman, a woman in her mid-life crisis, a businesswoman, a working mother, a single parent, an elderly woman, - each of you has a place in a circle - A local church may have a number of circles, each one unique and different. Yet a commonality binds them together.

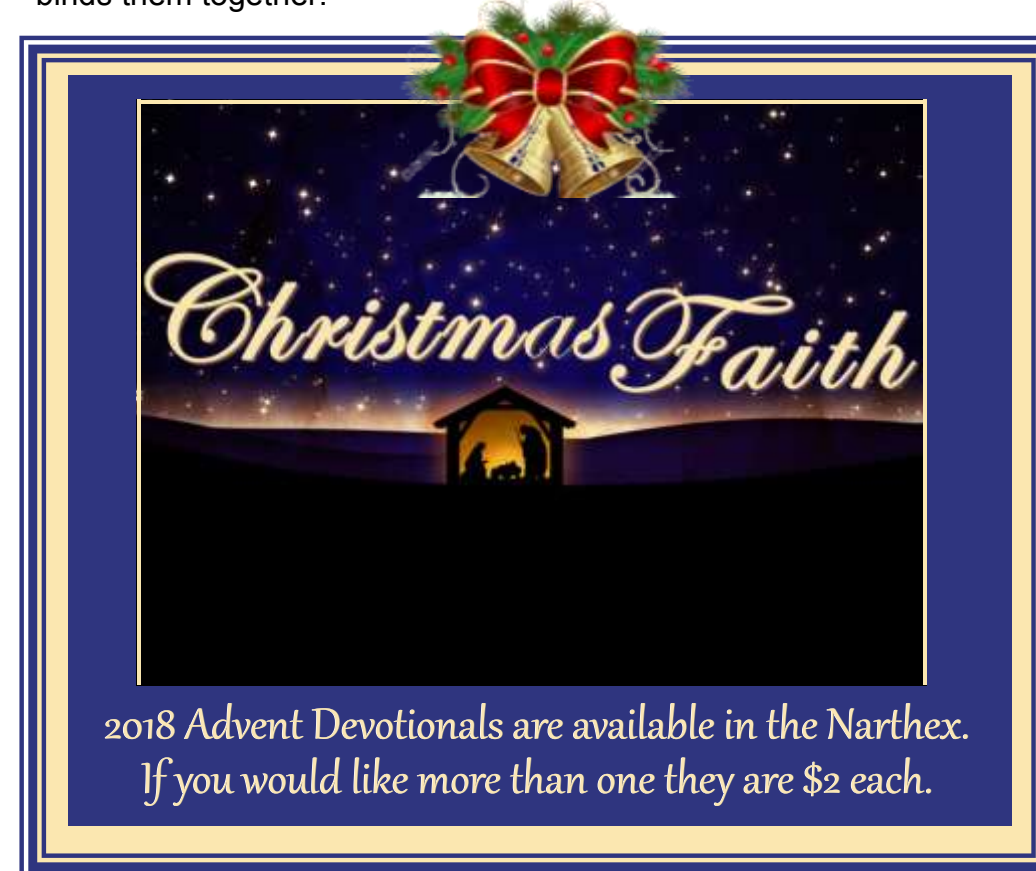
## WORSHIP
