

Nursery

The Godly Play - Ages 4 - 5th Grade *(meets in the Godly Play Room in building A)*

"The Godly Play approach helps children to explore their faith through story, to gain religious language, and to enhance their spiritual experience through wonder and play. Based on Montessori principles and developed using a spiral curriculum, the Godly Play method serves children through early, middle **and late childhood and beyond."** (The Godly Play Foundation)



Godly Play is a way of telling the stories of God and God's people that is faithful and imaginative. In Godly Play the children do not just learn about God, but the ultimate relationship between the child and God is nurtured. Lessons include:

- Listening to the Story – a story is told using manipulatives, then children are **given the opportunity to answer "wondering questions" and listen to others.**
- Response to story – each child can decide to journal, use story materials, read the story in the Bible, use art such as clay, painting, drawing, beads, etc.
- Feast and Prayer – students and teachers pray together, then enjoy a snack while conversing and building community



Middle School Sunday School:
(meets in the Youth Room)

Spice Rack is a downloadable Bible curriculum perfect for middle school students, with 15 individual studies that cover an entire year. Each lesson is packed with a variety of activities, discussion questions, and games, providing leaders the flexibility to use any time.



High School:

(meets in the Youth Room)

We are studying "Faith Questions". Each session encourages our youth to look to Scripture as well as our faith traditions in relevant and responsive ways.



Brewing Faith

(meets in Session Room)

For approximately the next three months, Brewing Faith will be studying "What Presbyterians Believe." We will be exploring and discussing our Reformed tradition and Calvinist theology, comparing and contrasting these convictions with the beliefs of our sister

Christian denominations. As our main texts, we will use the Bible, the Book of Confessions, the Book of Order, and various PC(USA) publications. We will study **what it means to be "a confessing church", as well as how Presbyterians view baptism and communion, and how these sacraments/ordinances speak to us, and yes, we will even discuss what "predestination" really means!** If you are interested in learning how our Reformed tradition developed, how speaks to us today, and how it differs from our Methodist, Lutheran, Episcopal, Catholic, or Baptist friends, we heartily invite you come join us in Brewing Faith.

Roads and Anchors class *(meets in the Roads & Anchors room)* studies a variety of contemporary Christian authors


and current events. "The Wired Word", is a weekly email based series which presents current events that have made the headlines the past week, along with relevant scripture references that provide a Christian perspective on the issue. Other authors we are studying are Henri Nouwen, Adam Hamilton, Martha Grace Reese and Debby Irving. The class sits in a large circle and is heavily discussion and open-ended question based.



Fellowship Class

(meets in the Fellowship classroom)

chooses a variety of material dealing with the books of the Bible and reformed theology, usually using study guides from PCUSA or books by current authors and presented by a variety of leaders in a lecture style format.



SIMPLE BASIC TRAINING

Sunday Evenings

We are studying 'The Bible Project', a simple, condensed online resource that is guiding us through the Bible. It helps us to answer the questions: Why should we study, what are we studying, and what is the purpose of **God's story in our lives?** All age classes are studying similar material each week so that families can develop conversations about what we are learning. Children are also engaged in music weekly with the purpose of their being an active part of worship monthly alongside our adult choir. Monthly we are inviting everyone to a fellowship event in the community to build bonds and explore the community. No matter what, there is something for everyone. You are invited to Simple Basic Training, where we are exploring the basics of faith.

- ◆ Adults are meeting in the Fellowship Classroom (Building B, bottom floor)
- ◆ Middle schoolers are meeting in the youth room (upstairs, building B),
- ◆ 5th grade and under will meet in the Room of Acts (building A, beside the fellowship hall)
- ◆ High Schoolers are invited to enlist as a Youth Leader for all ages. They are an integral part of making our Bible Boot Camp possible.
