Tell your neighbors or bring them when you come!





## DO YOU WANT TO FAST THIS LENT?

*In the words of Pope Francis*

- ♦ Fast from hurting words and say kind words.
- ♦ Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.
- ♦ Fast from anger and be filled with patience.
- ♦ Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
- ♦ Fast from worries and have trust in God.
- ♦ Fast from complaints & contemplate simplicity.
- ♦ Fast from pressures and be prayerful.
- ♦ Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy.
- ♦ Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.
- ♦ Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
- ♦ Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.





Can you believe that the month of March brings not only spring time beauty (hello pollen), but also the Lenten season of devotion? This month is upon us and this article seeks to help us all become clear about what is in store this Lent. There is much to be grateful for in the life of God's church as we kick off with a powerful Ash Wednesday worship on March 6<sup>th</sup>. During this season we will explore many facets of church growth together.

**Vitalization:** Let's begin at the beginning....Last year your session approved SOPC to participate in something called 'Revitalization', a program with Trinity Presbytery and churches across our bounds seeking God's call to the church of the future. The vitalization program is similar to the journey the United Methodists have taken to bring new life to their churches across America. This vitalization began during Lent of 2018 and included defining and exploring the 7 Marks of Vitalization: Lifelong discipleship, Intentional Evangelism, Outward Focus, Servant Leadership, Spirit Inspired Worship, Caring Relationships, and Ecclesial Health. As part of this process the session and congregation explored SOPC history and what we typically do/don't do well, explored our communities, and concluded with a survey that examined our marks in numerical form. The results of this survey are now in our hands as we enter into 2019 Lent. Session is now leading us through this year's Lenten process with a new vigor of exploration. During Lent we will explore once again the 7 marks of vitalization. Whereas last year we studied the more 'negative' side of the 7 marks (for instance lifelong discipleship was compared to complacent Christian piety or morals keeping), this Lent, we will be focusing on the positive side of these marks of vitalization (lifelong discipleship now looks at being and creating lifelong learners in our midst). We seek to define how we will now live into these positive marks of vitalization. Most of this work will be heard in Lenten worship services with a culmination of session seeking our path into the future with regards to our survey results. Our scores will help define what SOPC will set as goals for the coming years, thanks be to God.

**Worship:** During Lent we will explore God's vitalization through the 7 marks during worship as mentioned above. We will also be exploring new worship space in the fellowship hall as the renovation progresses. Stay tuned to when these changes might happen and know that we will remain in the sanctuary as long as we are able.

**Learning About One Another:** The recent task force has encouraged me to lead teaching opportunities for the congregation. Last year the vitalization included 8 long weeks of specific teaching. This year, I am offering a 2 week inter-generational Sunday School in the fellowship hall on March 3 and 10<sup>th</sup>. During this class we will explore why each of us are the way we are based on our own generational upbringing as well as how we can best be church together with these differences and similarities in mind. The youth will fundraise with morning goodies for sale, so come, learn, and grow with all generations from the church beginning at 9:45 a.m. Your input will be vital to this opportunity!

**Devotions:** Lent is a period of reflection and spiritual growth as we walk alongside Jesus' footsteps to the cross. To explore our own paths of faith, each Sunday the congregation will be provided a Lenten scriptural journey to study in the bulletin. If you want to dig deeper, please purchase the book by Mark Tidsworth, '40 Days of Prayer' and study these brief but poignant self-reflections on walking in faith. Let Alice or I know if you need help obtaining a copy! Like last year, a thought on these scriptures will be posted through social media for you to interact with others on this journey.




**WOMEN'S RETREAT**



## Holy Week

**Holy Week:** April 14 is Palm Sunday where Bootcamp will be hosting a Seder Meal for anyone who wishes to partake. Please register by Sunday, March 24th. No matter your participation in Bootcamp, this will be an informative and experiential way to dig into Christ's walk to the cross. See the blurb below to explore what a Seder is and why we are participating in this journey. This entire week will also be a week of *reflection and prayer* as we explore the 7 marks of vitalization in our own growth culminating of course on Easter, April 21<sup>st</sup>. I will be present in the sanctuary (if open), if not in the FH, each morning this week from 9-10 to pray with you and alongside of you.

**Good Friday:** Your pastors are part of a community pastoral support group which some of you witnessed last Good Friday at Pine Grove AME church (near Costco). We are in process of arranging a similar worship on April 19, Good Friday, and hope that all of you would come and worship the final moments of Christ's journey together as the body across all denominations. I am excited about how God is at work in our midst and I long to walk beside each of you growing this Lenten season. Bring a friend and let's explore Christ's call together!

**The Festival of Passover:** Passover is the oldest and most important religious festival in Judaism, commemorating God's deliverance of the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt and his creation of the Israelite people. Passover is actually composed of two festivals, The Feast of Unleavened Bread and Passover. The festival of Passover, known as Pesach, begins at sunset on the 14th of Nisan (usually in March or April) and marks the beginning of a seven day celebration that includes the Feast of Unleavened Bread. The focal point of Passover is a communal meal, called the Seder (which means "order," because of the fixed order of service), which is a time of rejoicing and celebration at the deliverance for the Hebrews that God accomplished in the exodus.

Unlike the most Holy days of Christianity that are observed in Church, since the destruction of the Jerusalem Temple in AD 70 Passover has been celebrated in the home with family and friends as they eat a meal together. It is customary to invite guests to share the Seder meal, especially newcomers to the community. The actual Seder meal in most Jewish homes is an elaborate feast, with food, games for the children, and plenty of time to tell the story of the Exodus from Egypt. It is not unusual for a Seder to last three to four hours (we will not last this long).

The Seder involves everyone present to share the story by participating in the Haggadah (Heb: "telling," the printed order of service, reading, and songs). While the father or grandfather is usually the leader of the service, others have roles as well. The mother of the home lights the festival candles that signal the beginning of Passover, the youngest child asks the four questions, the children help search for the hidden symbolic piece of Matzah, unleavened bread, and open the door for Elijah, the parents or the grandparents tell the story of the exodus, and various others are designated to read or lead certain portions of the service.

Passover is really more than a festival. It is an elaborate teaching experience, especially for the children, intended to call people to their identity as the People of God. By using all of the senses, the Passover Seder tells the story of God's grace in history and calls the participants to experience and share in the story as their own story. Passover becomes more than simply a service or a time; it becomes a way to confess faith in the One who has acted in history, and for Jews expresses the hope that He will continue to act in bringing deliverance to all people everywhere. For Christians, the Passover remembers the renewed covenant with God's people made by Jesus Christ. The Passover also looks forward to the complete redemption upon the return of our Savior.

## NEWS FROM YOUR SESSION

At its last meeting on February 11, 2019

1. Approved the establishment of a Safety Team which will include ushers and elders.
2. Approved locking all doors on the campus after the worship service begins.
3. Heard Frank Sheppard explain legal liability in relation to our Insurance Coverage. Frank said, "We are well insured at this church."
4. Discussed several sections of the Safety Committee report and designated Elders to do follow up research.
5. Approved designating the current balance in the G. Pilkington Memorial Music Fund to be spent on lighting for our renovated organ consoles music rack.
6. Approved calling a Congregational Meeting on March 31, 2019, for the purpose of Electing Elders and 2 Trustees. One for 2020 and one for the Class of 2022.
7. Approved setting June 2, 2019, as the date for installation and ordination of new officers.
8. Approved designating a half day on Christmas Eve & New Year's Eve as paid holidays for office staff.
9. Approved adopting the following resolution as the cover letter from the Reconciliation Task Force report. "The Session of SOPC wholeheartedly accepts Jana as our pastor, as she has been chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to guide us in the way of Jesus Christ. We agree to pray for her, to encourage her, to respect her decisions, and to follow as she guides us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is the Head of the Church. We urge all our fellow members to do likewise."
10. Approved dissolving the Reconciliation Task Force.
11. Approved the selling of purple bows and luminaries for \$10.00 each in the Narthex on April 7th and 14th to support the Relay for Life for the American Cancer Society.
12. Approved the Scouts using Fellowship Hall on March 30th.
13. Approved the ALANON Group using the Fellowship Classroom on July 13th.
14. Approved the use of podcasts by James Bryan Smith for use in the Roads and Anchors class.
15. Received the revised Policies and Procedures for the Prevention of child abuse as a first reading.
