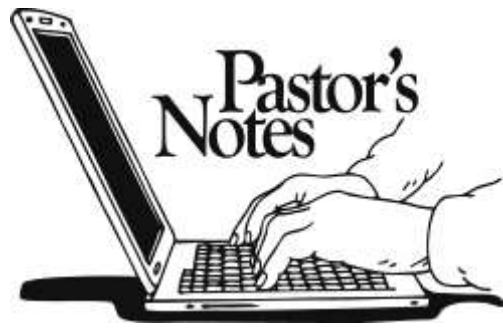

Alice and I just returned from a meeting with fellow pastors where we pondered the next steps of envisioning Trinity's program, Vital Congregations. It's a privilege to be building relationships and to imagine God's creativity with others on the same path, truly. One of the discussions we shared involved the creation story in Genesis and the repetition of God's words 'And It Was Good'. Over and over again God says this thing and we hear the words, it was good. For me this Lenten Season, the words 'It Was Good' resound in two different ways.

First, is the question, Is our church, the world, and creation in general living in the past? It *WAS* good implies that it no longer is. It implies that God is no longer working through creation to make all things new. And yet, the Easter Cross is looming and in that story, creation is given new life in Christ. Which means that if we follow Christ and we truly believe that the same *ruach* (Spirit) that hovered over the waters, empowered Christ with strength on that day, and still today moves our hearts to action and love IS STILL PRESENT, IF we believe that, then there is no place for the words 'It was good'. Instead, God calls us to believe in His own Re-creation and claim that God says it *IS* good.

Secondly, I recognized that embedded in these three words, It *IS* good, is a reflection for all of us. For every moment that we encounter, every individual we embrace or shun, every life circumstance that makes us question or seek, every hope or doubt we have about the future of God's church, God is *EVEN NOW* claiming that 'it IS good'. And if that is the case, that God's church is part of this recreation in our midst, and that we get to be a part of Christ's church on earth, then this is the good news of the cross and hope for the future. All of creation is participating in this promise of God in creation, Yes, Lord 'It IS good'. And then we pray the humble prayer, may it be so.

This Easter I invite you to reflect on your own understanding of God's creation. Do you find yourself as a child of God relishing in the past or are you hopeful for the future that was promised in the cross? Then you are invited to pray for the Lord our God, creator or all things to enter into our hearts and show us glimpses of how God is re-creating even now. Let us Pray this Easter, friends, Let us Pray.

11. Celebrated that worship attendance is 10% percent higher than 2018.
12. Received minutes from latest Presbytery meeting.
