Have you ever been in a room where you have felt the work of the Holy Spirit clearly in your midst? That's what it felt like when your session gathered for training at our recent retreat. As we worshipped and prayed, listened and discerned, it became clear that there is much work to be done but also much promise for God's kingdom here at Seven Oaks. One of the topics for conversation is the exploration of some results regarding SOPC's journey with Trinity Presbytery and the Re-Vitalization Process. We got a firsthand opportunity to shape the pilot program for Presbyteries across the USA- what an honor!

Now it's time for the congregation to get acquainted with what is happening behind the scenes. First, you have the opportunity to receive a copy of the survey results we took last November. Please stop by the office, greet Beth Morelock, and she has copies available. Second and more importantly, you should know a few things about this survey and the process before you delve in.

1. Session recapped the 'wins' over the last year and ways SOPC has experienced both growth and vitalization. They filled a whole whiteboard and three portable boards!
2. Session heard and recognized that Phil. 1:3-6 is at work in our midst. Go look it up!
3. Session heard and recognized the BOO reiterating that the reign of God is a present reality AND a future promise and that while the church's activities do not bring about that realm, they are a sign of confidence that God is doing great things!
4. Session prayed this prayer: **God of power and grace fill us with the wisdom of your Word and the understanding of your Spirit so that we may be your church: a people with dreams and vision at work in all the world; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.** We invite you to pray it as well before you read the results.
5. Session recognized that the survey was only a snapshot of SOPC in November of 2018 when the church was undergoing transition under a new pastor.
6. Session also recognized that the survey reminds us of the importance of learning more about US as a congregation (knowledge), making wise decisions that derive from praying (God's wisdom) and going outside into the world sharing the Good News (evangelism, our GREAT COMMISSION, Matt. 28:18-20).
7. Session spent hours working to identify both obstacles and stepping stones for sharing this Good News here at SOPC, with a focus on GROWTH and DEVELOPMENT of ministry and mission. Remember, we are laying the groundwork for churches and Presbyteries across the nation.
8. Session worked on each of the 7 vital marks within the congregation and began formulating possibilities of God's work for the future.
9. THE WORK IS NOT DONE! Session will be formulating goals and action plans into the next months, recognizing that we, as Christians, are accountable and responsible for representing and modeling principles of Jesus with Excellency, Efficiency, and Stewardship.
10. The reason this process is so important is that any reason for growth, improvement, or change should and will be based on the call of Jesus Christ in the church and in our lives. We hope to model and be a training ground for God's churches who will follow.
11. Session is now entering the hardest part- discerning how we will follow God's call incorporating faithfully all the results. Thank you for your prayers and look for regular updates on this vitalization process!

At its last stated Meeting on May 20th, your Session took the following actions:

NEWS FROM YOUR SESSION

1. Greeted our three candidates for Confirmation: Megan Shuler, Thomas Taylor, and Max Werner. Elders broke into three groups and met the candidates, discussed their confirmation training and read their faith Statements. Satisfied with their knowledge and understanding of the purpose of confirmation and the vow they will be taking, the Session voted them to be received into the fellowship of the church on Pentecost Sunday, June 9.
2. Met Dr. Barry Shatzer, an honorably retired PCUSA minister, who has offered to volunteer at Seven Oaks as a Parish Associate. The Session voted Unanimously to have him join the staff as an unpaid Parish Associate. Barry has joined the choir and may be teaching an adult Sunday School class. His passion is Social Justice.
3. The next Stated Session Meeting will be July 15, at 6:30 pm. It was decided due to VBS and the Habitat trip, to not have a meeting in June.
4. The evaluation of oncoming elders was set for Sunday, June 9 at 9 am in the Session Room.
5. Learned that CO monitors and smoke alarms have been installed on our campus.
6. Learned that usher training and head usher training has taken place. Training was done by Usher Ron Kesterson.
7. Learned that first aid kits on our campus are being checked and updated. New one has been purchased for Fellowship Hall.
8. Learned that the sound system in the sanctuary has been evaluated and that some new procedures and equipment will be tried.
9. Approved second reading to the Head Usher Instructions.
10. Approved serving communion by intinction on the special holidays of Maundy Thursday, Pentecost and Christmas Eve, where Communion is celebrated twice each month.
11. Approved the baptism of Asher Mellitz on July 14.
12. Elected Hal Bowman as Treasurer for 2019 – 2020.
13. Elected Jim Wilhide as Clerk of Session for 2019 – 2020.
14. Elected Shelagh Wirth as Membership Secretary for 2019 – 2020.
15. Approved the Administration Policy 2019 for the first reading.
16. Approved the recommendation that our Session size should be reduced to 15 over the next three years.
17. Approved commissioning the Nominating Committee to select a candidate to fill the vacant seat on the Board of Trustees.
18. Approved the following persons to work in Vacation Bible School: Paula Giugliano, Janice Riser, Anne Crook, Karan Bundrick, Emalee Dillard, Kathy Morganelli, Nancy Taber, Ron Kesterson, Jenny Fogle, Robin Lingel, Jake Fogle, Robert Miller, Vern Rogers, Tara Whitfield, Carol Griffith and Jean Mandeville.
