NEW TESTAMENT READING

1 John 3:1-3

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ² Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. ³ And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Deuteronomy 34:1-9

Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the LORD showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, ²all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, ³the Negeb, and the Plain—that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees—as far as Zoar. ⁴The LORD said to him, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, 'I will give it to your descendants'; I have let

you see it with your eyes, but you shall not cross over there.”⁵ Then Moses, the servant of the LORD, died there in the land of Moab, at the LORD’s command.⁶ He was buried in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth-peor, but no one knows his burial place to this day.⁷ Moses was one hundred twenty years old when he died; his sight was unimpaired and his vigor had not abated.⁸ The Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days; then the period of mourning for Moses was ended.⁹ Joshua son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, because Moses had laid his hands on him; and the Israelites obeyed him, doing as the LORD had commanded Moses.

One: Throughout 2020 COVID-19 has taken an immeasurable toll on human life. The deaths – over 1 million worldwide and over 220,000 in our nation – are difficult to comprehend. We risk becoming numb to such enormous loss.

All: We are reminded on this All Saints Sunday that each one of these dead was a beloved human soul with a name, a story, friends, and family. As Christians, it is right to communally remember their lives and grieve their deaths.

One: We remember those who died alone in quarantine, unable to say final goodbyes to loved ones.

All: May they find peace among the great cloud of saints in the Church Triumphant, and may God comfort those left to mourn.

One: We remember the elderly for whom this plague was simply too great to overcome.

All: We thank God for their faithfulness, wisdom, and care throughout all the seasons of their lives.

One: We remember the young who were in their prime, and who have left so much work undone.

All: We thank God for all they were; mothers, fathers, sons, daughters, and friends.

One: Finally, we remember those health care workers who paid the ultimate price while caring for others.

All: There is no greater love than this: that a person would lay down their life for the sake of others. May they receive eternal reward in heaven.

One: Lord, for all your saints still fighting the good fight, who are sick and overwhelmed, those who are loved beyond measure within and outside this church, this city, this country and this world, we ask your blessings, healings, touch, and Spirit to pour upon their souls.

All: On this All Saints Sunday we name, honor, and remember. May God pour out healing on our bodies, minds, and souls. Amen
