### History of the Peace Light from Bethlehem

The tradition of Scouting and the Peace Light began in Austria in the late 1980's. Each year, a Scout from Upper Austria fetches the light - a live Eternal Flame- from the Grotto of the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. The light is then transported to Vienna, Austria under the auspices of the International Scouting Movement.

During the weeks before Christmas, Scouts distribute the light to more than 30 European countries, throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico, through the generosity of Austrian Airlines, and the cooperation of the Brooklyn Catholic Committee on Scouting and the Greater New York Council. In past years the Peace Light has been presented to Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI, members of the European parliament in Strasbourg, and the United Nations Troops in Kosovo.


On November 20, 2021, eleven-year-old Tobias Nusbaumer from Kirchham, Austria, was escorted to the Grotto of the Nativity in Bethlehem by a Greek Orthodox priest where they lit the Light of Peace. From there they traveled to Vienna with Austrian Airlines, bringing the symbol of peace to Europe. The light was distributed in Austria at a Service of Dedication to Scouting delegations from across Europe who take it back, with a message of Peace, to their own countries for use at ecumenical services throughout the Continent. Scouts and Guides then take the light on to other churches, hospitals, old people homes, prisons, and places of public, cultural and political importance - to anybody that appreciates the significance of the gift.

Austrian Airlines transported the Light of Peace to New York, arriving at JFK on December 11, 2021. After a sharing ceremony at the airport, the Light immediately started its travels across the United States, with the living flame being carried by lantern by volunteers in the Scouting movement.

This year the light has travelled from Bethlehem to Austria, to New York, and then to Indianapolis with Thomas & Brian Duane, Mayflower Council Pack 105 in Pembroke, MA. From there Steven Driver, Lincoln Heritage Council, Troop 1 in Jeffersonville, IN brought it to Murfreesboro, TN, and Fredrich Maney, brought it to the Atlanta Area Council. Liene Kukainis then received the light from Atlanta coordinator Fontaine Kohler and brought it to Troop and Pack 30, Blue Ridge Council, in Greenville SC. Lorie McGraw of Troop 91, Indian Waters Council, received the light in Greenville and brought the Peace Light to share with Columbia SC and surrounding areas.

**This is the fourth year that the Peace Light has made it to South Carolina.** Please carry the flame with you. You may transport the live flame, or you may light a candle and allow the Peace Light from Bethlehem to infuse the candlewick. It may then be extinguished and be carried unlit to its destination. Once there you may relight the candle, and the spirit of the Peace Light from Bethlehem will be with you. Please share with others the message of Peace in the World and become a Messenger of Peace.
