

i guess i haven't learned that yet shauna niequist This group will study the book I Guess I Haven't Learned That Yet by Shauna Neiquist. Shauna is a middle-aged married Mom with two kids who, due to changing life circumstances, finds her family relocating from her comfortable suburb of Chicago to the very different world of mid-town Manhattan. Her life has been falling apart due to illness and changes in her family and home church. She is discovering that many of the beliefs and practices that she has usually turned to are no longer serving her. After trying--and failing--to pull herself back up using the same old strategies and systems, she realizes that she requires new ones: courage, curiosity, and compassion. She discovers the way through is more about questions than answers, more about forgiveness than force, more about tenderness than trying hard. We will explore the variety of emotions and challenges that accompany a transformed life. It is a well-written, poignant book that will lead to some lively discussions and hopefully some transformation of our own.

DONATION ITEMS NEEDED FOR NUEVA PAZ

<u>Toiletries:</u> Toothpaste, bath soap, toothbrushes, razors, deodorant

<u>Food:</u> macaroni and cheese, Seasonings (such as goyas, cumin, complete seasoning (like Badia "Sazón Completa"), garlic powder, bay leaf, pepper, cinnamon etc.) soft drinks, jelly or jam, coffee, candies and chocolates, tea.

Sunday school materials: Beads, mechanical pencils (lead sizes 0.5 and 0.7), pencils, colored paper Rulers, cases for school materials, clay (perhaps modeling clay or Play Dough), curriculum materials for Sunday school teachers, push pins and/or thumb tacks, staplers and staples. NOTE: We already have crayons, and markers. No need to bring these.

<u>Clothes and shoes</u>: Shoes (sizes #38 - #43 - US sizes 7 - 12), underpants (men's and women's), Stockings, bras for adults (sizes M, L, XL). NOTE: We want these things for the elderly folks of our breakfast project. Also, the shoes don't have to be new. I don't want you to spend money but perhaps you have shoes from yourselves that you no longer use or maybe some could be donated.

<u>Important:</u> at least 2 rechargeable lamps (for power failures), 2 microphones, 3 used computers

batteries (AA, AAA)

<u>Sewing Supplies:</u> fabrics, thread (all colors), whatever you can bring sewing needles

<u>Christmas:</u> ornaments for Christmas tree in sanctuary (We already have lights). (We would like to set up a nativity scene in the church for Christmas. Do you think that will be very expensive?)

Young people: flash drives.
