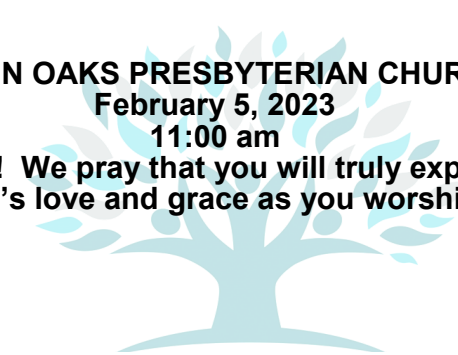

Women's Bible Study:

Believing God: Experiencing a Fresh Explosion of Faith by Beth Moore is based on Isaiah 43:10 and explores what it means to not only believe in God but to believe Him. Do you take God at God's Word, believing what God has told you, or do you just believe in God's existence and the salvation offered? Beth Moore came face-to-face with this question well into adulthood. At first, her response to God was, "Lord, of course I believe in You. I've believed in You all my life." Over time, the Holy Spirit led her to understand God was saying, "I didn't ask you to believe in Me. I asked you to believe Me."
