IAM


- 1. By your birth I am loved.

More than 800 people attended the Nehemiah Action for MORE Justice on March 27th. 15 of those represented Seven Oaks Presbyterian! We had a successful negotiation with the Officials who attended.


For **Food Justice**, Mayor Rickenmann responded YES to supporting publicly owned land for local healthy food iniatives, such as pop-up markets, produce stands, community gardens and more. He also agreed to work with MORE Justice to develop that legislation and to supporting the sustainability of the Mobile Market.

The **Affordable Housing** research team asked Paul Livingston and Allison Terracio to commit to request a half-day workshop for the County Council with experts around Housing Trust Funds. They said YES to presenting an ordinance to establish a Rich-

land Co. Affordable Housing Trust Fund for the reading by Sept. 19th.


