

ReShape Update

ReShape Our ReShape Ministry Guide is the foundation upon which we are transforming our church. Each of you has a copy, but it may not be high on your reading list. That is why we are reproducing the Executive Summary in this newsletter, to remind you of the process we went through to develop the Guide, and our hopes that it inspires us to "stay the course" and embrace its recommendations.

Executive Summary

This ReShape Ministry Guide represents a six-month discernment process that has engaged approximately 88 members of the congregation, lay leadership, and staff, capturing and integrating what we have learned about ourselves as individuals and as members of the church during a disruptive time in our lives, church, community, and world.

What has come through loud and clear throughout this reshape process is the overwhelming desire for Seven Oaks Presbyterian Church to continue as an active and important institution with significant and meaningful presence in our community.

With this vision clearly before us, ReShape focused on understanding volatile events such as the COVID pandemic and political and ideological polarization that have disrupted the world and the life of our church.

As we gathered in our small groups for eight consecutive weeks, we began to share personal experiences and learn from one another just how these volatile events have impacted and continue impact worship in our church.

Seven Oaks is a widely represented congregation of all political views and instead of drawing ourselves together to talk and try to understand each other during these volatile times we have allowed ourselves to be influenced by media narratives bent on polarizing us against one another.

Our prayer is that this Ministry Guide will serve as a strong foundation for actions that will guide us as we undergo the changes that will propel us into a united, vibrant community of faith and transform Seven Oaks Presbyterian Church into a greater expression of the body of Christ.

LIFE LINE (The Power of Prevention 16

Life Line Screening goes beyond regular checkups to look inside your arteries for signs of plaque build-up

All 4 Screenings for \$149

Carotid Artery Disease:

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to vour brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

Peripheral Arteria Disease (PAD):

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.1

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA):

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, stroke, and heart failure, which is a life-threatening medical emergency.



Atrial Fibrillation :

A 6-lead

electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation, AFib can lead to blood clots. and other heart-related complications.2
