

ReShape Update

On May 9, SOPC celebrated its one year anniversary of the issuance of Re-Shape Ministry Guide. As you know, the Ministry Guide was the culmination of "grass roots" small group process, where 10 small groups comprising over 60% of our membership were guided through a structured process developed by Pinnacle Leadership Associates. This process generated over 500 ideas that were submitted to our ReShape Coordinating Team. They went through a discernment process and issued the Guide.

Our efforts this year have been to concentrate on implementing the top 26 Action Items in the Guide. As of this writing, we have completed 31 actions,

(some Action Items resulted in several actions, others have not been completed yet.)

ReShape is a work in progress, and although some members have not seen the degree of change they originally anticipated, There are promising signs:

The youth in particular have made major strides in making changes that are consistent with ReShape recommendations: They wrote a Vision Board, they have joint meetings with their counterparts at McGregor and Westminster, and they have been active participants in our Worship service—reading Scripture, performing skits, helping serve communion, offering to greet and usher.

Members are involved in looking into the type of music we want to play during worship—continue with our largely traditional music, add outside elements like performances by other choirs, soloists, bands, etc. or even consider pre recorded music from time to time.

The restrictions in music selection due to copyright law and performance licenses are being challenged and better understood so that we may broaden our music selections.

Opportunities for intergenerational Programming are being explored, with programs and events that "speak" across generations and promote better appreciation for what each has to offer.

These are just a few of the things that are going on with ReShape. For a more complete picture, refer to your Ministry Guide, check out the ReShape bulletin boards and read the bulletin for weekly updates.

Life Line Screening goes beyond regular checkups to look inside your arteries for signs of plaque build-up



All 4 Screenings for \$149

Carotid Artery Disease:

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

Peripheral Arterial Disease (PAD):

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.¹

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA):

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, which is a life-threatening medical emergency.

Atrial Fibrillation:

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications.²
