Dear Seven Oaks Friends,

February is considered the month of love. Valentine's, while a mostly manufactured holiday, is a day most of us celebrate and love one another a little bit more or a little bit harder. This first week of February, I have been honored to share one last time this love for many of you--sometimes in cards, sometimes in hugs, sometimes in sitting over coffee, sometimes dinner or over a conversation in your living rooms. What a blessing to share with one another this love that is Godly and greater than any one of us.

One of the sermons I preached here at SOPC spoke about the types of love presented in the Bible. "Agape" love is defined as the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. "Eros" is the Greek word that is used to describe the romantic love between a man and a woman. "Storge" is the Greek word used to describe the natural, overflowing love that family members have for one another "Philia" is the Greek word used to describe deep, meaningful friendships.

The prayer we have often shared is that each of us will know, grow, and experience these types of love in our lives and in the congregation.

Perhaps you have grown in Agape love, the type of all-sacrificing love that Christ personified as He was sacrificed on the cross. This type of love overlooks faults, gives all, welcomes all into the love of Christ, and as Charles Wesley wrote in his hymn, "Amazing love! how can it be, That Thou, my God, shouldst die for me?" Agape love is the love that calls us to be into the presence of God and to 'be still and know'. Now as things change once again, I encourage you to once again 'be still and know' this God.

Perhaps, however, you have grown in Eros love during these past 6 years. Maybe your relationships were rocky and as you have grown in the faith, you have experienced growth in your love for your partner. Maybe you have found a new love or strengthened your ties in this love. Eros love is a significant foundation, aside from Agape love, that we can build in our lives to reflect Christian love to all others.

Perhaps, though, you find yourself understanding the importance of Storge love during your growth over these 6 years. The significance of family love is vital, no matter our age and stage. Those who have said goodbye to siblings are acutely aware of this missing piece. I am grateful to have been able to share some of these stories and grieve together. Family love in extended family or others who are not family by blood are also critical to our growth as well. As Christians, we need our roots inherently embedded in a safe place. For some of us the church has become that safe place, that family. I would invite all of you to take this time of be still and know and utilize it to recreate your family units here at SOPC. With the changes in congregation over the last years, the church as a whole needs one another to experience storge, familial, and natural love, perhaps expressed in person, in cards, on the phone, and in your shepherding groups.

Finally though, you may find yourself in the place where Philia love, friendship love, is where you have grown the most over this time together. This deep and meaningful friendship love extends within and outside of the church. As we all know, friendships need encouragement to grow. They need time and effort to thrive. They need watering with conversations, dealing with disappointments together, and mending bridges. What friendships can you be a part of watering as we are 'being still and knowing' this coming season as a Church?

Friends, my prayer as you enter this coming season, is that you seek and find the love of Christ anew and from there you build all of your other relationships embedded in this knowledge and love. The result will be, in the Godly way, more connections, more relationships, more welcome, and more love shared within SOPC. May you each know the love which I will carry for you into the coming season, the prayers that will sustain you, and the ministries that will be upheld into the light on your behalf. You are always and forever loved in Christ, church of Seven Oaks. Thank you for sharing this love with me.

Adults under 62 - \$61.00 per person (includes bus and tour ticket)


Seniors 62+ - \$55.00 per person (includes bus and tour ticket)






# THE LOVE REVOLUTION
