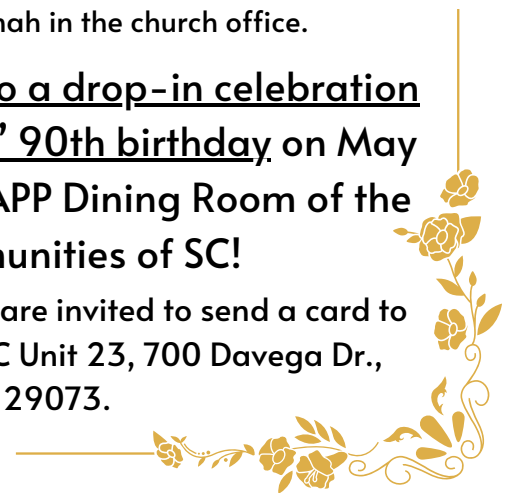

Team members are: Rollin Cartee (Youth Representative), Mark Dillard, Polly Robinson, and Josie Wilkes, with assistance from Annah Hiers, Mark Wishart and Evan Carson, all of whom have experience in web design, social media, and graphic design.

The essence of the Good News charter is to "engage our neighbors in Christian love and show them a better way of living: as disciples of Jesus Christ AND as members of Seven Oaks PC."

Our focus this year will be to enhance our "digital presence." Through our new interactive website, facilitated by our management consultants at Church Fuel, we have the opportunity to MINISTER to our web visitors as opposed to just marketing what we have going on. There is a "Plan Your Visit" button on our website and "How can we pray for you?" posts on Facebook that connect the web visitor to our church. This will enable us to build a relationship with the visitor, perhaps even before they attend their first worship service with us!

The Good News ministry is developing a guide to train volunteer members (called "liaisons") to interact with our visitors in the best possible way.
